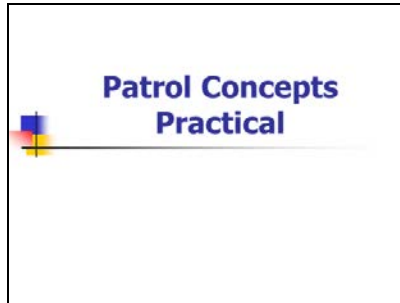

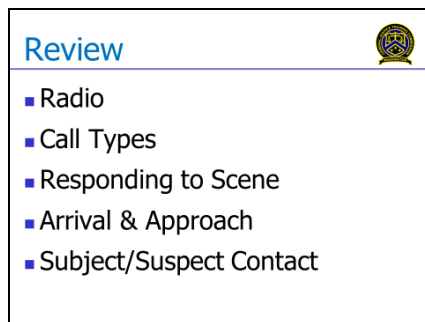
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SAY TO CLASS

In this Session, we will use the BLEA Problem Solving Model to create and work through a mock scene within your squads. We will start with a review of the following tactics when presented with a call:



- Radio
- Call Types
- Responding to Scene
- Arrival & Approach
- Subject/Suspect Contact

SAY TO CLASS



The following topics are important to review:

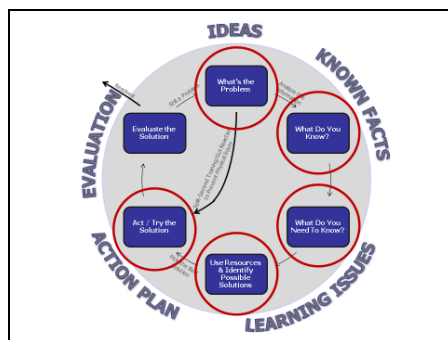
- Radio
 - Coordination with Dispatch & back-up
 - Running plates
 - Running registered owner info
 - Arrival
 - Status updates
- Call Types
 - Emergency
 - Non-emergency
 - Courtesy
 - Examples of each
 - Does department policy specify these?
 - Which type is this?
 - Emergency (code) response policies



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- Responding to the Scene
 - Fixing location in your mind
 - Check the map first play “what if” game
 - Think about subjects fleeing/leaving the scene as you are approaching
 - Coordination with other units
 - First officer in is in charge (primary)
- Arrival & Approach (Silent & Invisible Deployment)
 - Parking away from scene
 - Don’t drive past
 - Turn off emergency equipment
 - Unfasten seatbelt
 - Turn down radios
 - Avoid fatal funnels
 - Move to/from cover
 - Use concealment
 - Beware of unrelated threats
 - Approach on foot
 - Maintain distance / interview stance
- Contacting a Subject/Suspect
 - ID self and state authority
 - Pre-attack indicators
 - Watch the hands
 - Flight indicators
 - Frisk Factors
 - Frisk as soon as legally possible
 - Deception indicators
 - Contraband/evidence in plain view

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GROUP EXERCISE - Mock Scene Creation / Presentation

Time: 2 hrs 20 min (40 work / 1 hr 40 min presentations)

Materials: • Easel & Pens

Instructions: In your group, you will have 40 minutes to create a mock scene for any kind of call you want. The outcome of the call is up to your group (arrest, social contact, Terry stop turns social or arrest, etc.).

Each group will assign roles to each member: dispatcher, witness(es), officers, suspects

At the end of 40 minutes, each group will have 20 minutes to act out their scenario focusing on:

- Officer safety concepts
- Legal justification for what you did or didn't do

After each presentation, spend 5 minutes to debrief the scene as a class.
