Read carefully and choose the best possible answer. More than one RCW <u>may</u> or <u>may not</u> apply to the question.

- 1. By definition, when a person or object cannot be clearly discernible at a distance of 500 feet, this is considered **hours of darkness**, RCW **46.04.200**.
- 2. A signal of intention to turn or move right or left when required shall be given continuously during not less than the last 100 feet traveled by the vehicle before turning.

RCW 46.61.305 Heading When signals required – Improper use prohibited

3. No driver shall make a U-turn near the crest of a grade or upon any curve where he has less than <u>500</u> feet visibility in each direction.

RCW 46.61.295 Heading Prohibited "U" Turns

4. "Roadway" means: (full definition please) That portion of a highway improved, designed, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel, exclusive of the sidewalk or shoulder even though such sidewalk or shoulder is used by persons riding bicycles.

In the event a highway includes two or more separated roadways, the term "roadway" shall refer to any such roadway separately but shall not refer to all such roadways collectively.
