Instructions:

This handout is in your Module 4 Study Guide.

Individually, you will have <u>1.5 hours</u> to research the RCW using the scenarios as a guide. Remember, you are responsible for learning more than just the infractions in these 25 scenarios, but these have been provided to you in order to help you explore specific categories. Sometimes more than one infraction may seem to fit for just one observed violation. You are expected to pick the one that fits best.

There may be more than one violation per scenario (i.e. seatbelt violation and a speed violation). Be sure to include all infractions discovered for each scenario. Be sure you have located and can list or explain:

- The elements needed to enforce the sections
- The proper enforcement methods for each violation
- The penalty or bail amount if applicable

We will meet back here in 1.5 hours and discuss each scenario. Be prepared to explain and support your answer.

NOTE TO FACILITATOR

Lead a 20-minute discussion on pretext stops and the court cases listed below. For each case, ask the squads to take 3-4 minutes to decide what the implications of the case are. They should use the Legal Update document you just handed out.

- 1. State v. Ladson 138 Wn.2d 343 (the case that essentially started it all here in Washington)
- 2. Whren v. U.S.(United States Supreme Court case ruling there is no such thing as a 'pretext stop – in contrast to Washington State Supreme Court that acknowledges they do exist)
- 3. State v. DeSantiago 97 Wn. App. 129
- 4. State v. Hoang 101 Wn. App. 732.



IMPORTANT POINT

In 2011, Senate Bill 5242 was signed into law prohibiting "Motorcycle Profiling."

"Motorcycle Profiling" means the illegal use of the fact that a person rides a motorcycle or wears motorcycle-related paraphernalia as a factor in deciding to stop and question, take enforcement action, arrest, or search a person or vehicle with or without a legal basis under the United States Constitution or Washington State Constitution.
