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SAY TO CLASS

During this Module, you have been learning about traffic enforcement. Sometimes we will arrest a suspect as part of a traffic stop, or when a person is near a vehicle. We need to know the "rules" for searching vehicles. In this session we will address the authority to search and practice conducting a search.

In addition to searching a vehicle, we will also discuss impounding vehicles.

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PRACTICAL EXERCISE - Vehicle Searches

Instructions:

Depending on availability of vehicles and remaining time, set up 1 or more stations in the parking lot using training vehicles that have contraband items (weapons and/or drugs) hidden in them. Have the students practice searching the vehicles for 40 min. Make sure to remind the students of the difference between a vehicle "search" and a vehicle "inventory".

Alternative: Have actors in the vehicle(s) and set up scenarios where the student officers have to determine if they can justify searching the vehicle depending on the situation.
