#### **Alarm Response Facts**

- Most are false
  - Leads to view of alarms as nuisance rather than high-risk calls
- □ 11% of police deaths during investigation of robberies in progress (FBI/UCR)
- □ 6% of police deaths during investigation of burglaries in progress

- □ Audible
  - Monitored
  - Unmonitored
- □ Silent
- □ Panic



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#### NOTE TO FACILITATOR

Use the second hour to run the following practical scenarios. Run the bank hold-up scenario first, and if time remains, run the silent commercial alarm:

#### SCENARIO I: Bank Hold-up Alarm (False)

Recruits dispatched to a bank hold-up alarm. Several Recruits act as customers and possibly a bank manager, or you can have Nichol act as a teller (front desk).

Officer Recruits should see business as usual and foot traffic in and out of the building along with a information from radio that the alarm is false.

Officer Recruits should approach using available cover, ask for a description of the manager or teller that would meet them outside, and designate a place to meet. They should then enter the bank and confirm the alarm false via the open line that Radio has maintained with the bank.

#### SCENARIO II: Silent Commercial Burglary Alarm

Recruits are dispatched to a commercial silent burglary alarm with general motion trips.

Recruits should approach using available cover and concealment and start checking doors and windows for an open premise. No open premise is found, so the scene should be cleared via radio.
